In 1790 Dr. Nicket's eldest daughter, Mary, married Wm. Turnbull, Esq. She died about 1824, leaving 4 sons & 5 daughters. In 1840 all of these are living except one son.

In 1795 the younger daughter, Alison, married Dr. M.'s lawyer and was left a widow in 1818. She is still living in 1840, with 1 son & 2 daughters surviving from 3 sons & 3 daughters. The daughter Mary married Rev. George Mason (daughter the son of Past John M. Mason 1821-4) - see the daughter Alison m. Esq. Charles D. Cleaveland, Esq. in Dec. College 1830-2.

The 2nd son, Alexander M. and for many years was Justice of the City Court of Baltore. He had 3 sons & 4 daughters. In 1840 only 2 daughters survived. Memorials of Dr. Nicket, made in 1840. Page 302 - of Rev. Samuel Miller
